



When Bill Clinton gained office as president in January 1993, Hillary Rodham Clinton became the first lady. She became part of the innermost circle vetting appointments to the new administration. Her choices filled at least eleven top-level positions and dozens more lower-level ones.

Clinton was a subject of several investigations Whitewater controversy, Travelgate, Filegate, and Hillary Clinton cattle futures controversy.

Hilary Clinton sat on the United States Senate (2001–2009) and was Secretary of State (2009–2013)

Clinton gave testimony to two congressional foreign affairs committees on January 23, 2013, regarding the Benghazi attack. She defended her actions in response to the incident.

Hilary and her daughter joined her husband as named members of the Bill, Hillary & Chelsea Clinton Foundation in 2013.

2015, Clinton formally announced her candidacy for presidency in the 2016 election and lost to Donald Trump.

On September 29, 2019, in an interview with CBS News Sunday Morning, Clinton described Trump as a "threat" to the country's standing in the world; and an "illegitimate president", despite having won the election; and a "corrupt human tornado"

In September 2019, the State Department finished its internal review into 33,000 emails that Clinton had turned over. The investigation that began in 2016 found 588 violations of security procedures and found that Clinton's use of personal email server increased the risk of compromising State Department information.
